#### MUS 135 - Class Guitar I

1 Credit Hour Spring 2024

A lecture/demonstration teaching method designed to acquaint the beginning guitar student with appropriate skills for playing the guitar in a variety of styles and settings. From this class the student can advance to applied guitar.
