Syllabus for MUS 098 – Worship Lab

1.0 Credit hours Spring 2024

I. COURSE DESCRIPTION

A course giving students opportunities to share views on worship and to dialogue with music representatives, professional music ministers, recording artists, studio musicians, professors, and pastors. The purpose of this course is to give the students a venue that recreates an actual worship leading experience. This includes lectures, demonstrations and most importantly- worship leading utilizing either a keyboard or guitar

- 5. Work in a group setting to plan and execute a night of Worship.
