I. COURSE DESCRIPTION

One 25-minute private lesson per week.

Pre-requisite: Department and instructor approval

Instrument Use Fee: \$55.00

Applied Lesson Fee: \$250.00 per credit hour for non-majors.

 - 1. Evaluation Procedures
 - a) Students are graded on attendance, attitude, and improvement
 - b) All students begin with a "B" (average) grade at the beginning of each semester. This grade is maintained by meeting the following criteria:
 - i. Reliable and prompt attendance at lessons
 - ii. A written practice record maintained weekly, showing at least five daily practice sessions/week (30-60 minutes per day as assigned by the instructor)
 - iii. Progress must coincide with the practice record, or the grade will be dropped at the discretion of the instructor.
 - iv. One unexcused absence allowed (i.e., notifying the instructor 24 hours before the absence is an excused absence)
 - v. One jury in a two-semester span.
 - c) A grade of "A" (above-average) reflects the following:
 - i. Reliable and prompt attendance in lesson.
 - ii. A written practice record maintained weekly, showing at least **six** daily practice sessions/week (30-60 minutes per day as assigned by the instructor).
 - iii. Progress must coincide with the practice record, or the grade will be dropped at the discretion of the instructor.
 - iv. NO unexcused absences allowed.
 - v. One jury I a two-semester span.
 - d) The student's grade may be lowered if any of the above criteria are not met.
 - e) Extra credit may be given for written reports (assigned by the instructor) or extra performances other than the required jury.
